CSPH received CEPH accreditation in 2010.

Provide interpretations of university policies in all aspects of faculty employment, promotion and tenure. Provide leadership in developing and implementing faculty policies and procedures. Serve as school liaison for campus and university faculty affairs matters. Coordinate the external review of departments in the CSPH. Assist with the promotion and implementation of university and school diversity and health equity objectives. Participate in budgetary planning.

On July 1, 2001, Alliant University, including the CSPP, entered into an agreement with United States International University, resulting in the combination of these two private institutions under the name, Alliant International University. AIU is a doctoral-intensive nonprofit university with eight locations in the United States, Mexico, and Kenya.
- Primary Responsibilities:** Chief Executive Officer of Alliant International University, an independent and not-for-profit, WASC-accredited higher education institution, enrolling approximately 6500 students with an annual operating budget approaching \$60 million. Undergraduate programs are offered in the liberal arts and business through the College of Arts and Sciences; graduate programs offered through the California School

of Professional Psychology, the California School of Organizational Studies, and the School of Social and Policy Studies, including APA-approved clinical psychology programs (PhD and PsyD), as well as graduate degrees in organizational, forensic, and health psychology, marriage and family therapy, and other human services fields. The Graduate School of Education provides teacher credential programs, as well as masters and doctoral degrees in education and a doctorate in school psychology. The United States International College of Business offers baccalaureate through doctoral programs in business administration and international business administration.

Campuses included four in California (San Francisco Bay Area, Fresno, Los Angeles, and San Diego) and satellite campuses in Sacramento and Orange County, as well as two international campuses, in Mexico City and Nairobi, Kenya. Appointed by and reporting directly to the Board of Trustees, the President oversees all academic and administrative operations, establishes fiscal policy and institutional priorities, oversees the annual operating budget, and provides leadership to advance the institution's mission, including strategic planning and establishment of the long-range vision. The President also is responsible for fund-raising, representing the organization's interests and accomplishments to external constituencies, and serves as president of the Research and Service Foundation, which supports applied research, professional service, and product development that bring psychology and related disciplines to bear on the problems of contemporary society.

Major Accomplishments: Spearheaded the transformation of the California School of Professional Psychology from a single-subject professional school into a broadly-based and multifaceted university, Alliant International University. This involved restructuring four independent campuses, focused primarily on the training of clinical psychologists, into an integrated system organized as multiple schools and colleges functioning across all sites.

Initiated and directed a major planning effort involving faculty, administrators, students, staff and alumni. The three-year reorganization project was designed to positively impact the institutional economy by eliminating costly administrative redundancies while diversifying programs. To this end, four schools spanning five locations were created: the California School of Professional Psychology, the Graduate School of Education, the California School of Organizational Studies, and the School of Social and Policy Studies.

While holding tuition constant for three consecutive years, restructured the institutional economy, reducing administrative overhead through reorganization and shared resource planning. Resulting savings allowed reallocation to fund salary increases and significantly improve the institution's retirement plan for employees. Established a centralized budget and fiscal management function that enabled the system-wide monitoring of enrollments and admissions across all the campuses, better enrollment management, and reallocation of resources.

Improved communication and advocacy for the University through statewide and national initiatives, legislative advocacy and testimony, public affairs activities, speeches, presentations, and service on professional boards and advisory groups. Established the first institutional office focused on private fund-raising. Initiated efforts to bring the first federal grants to support undergraduate education to the University (Title V, Trio).

Launched five major new academic programs in four years, including a post-doctoral master's degree in clinical psychopharmacology, doctoral programs in forensic psychology, school, and consulting psychology, master's degree programs in organizational psychology, and a grant-supported master's degree program in counseling psychology for Native Americans, as well as teacher certification programs.

Negotiated the transfer of control of United States International University to Alliant University, subsequently creating Alliant International University. This combination

added an undergraduate college in San Diego, as well as new graduate programs in business and education, and campuses in Nairobi, Kenya, and Mexico City, Mexico, thereby substantially increasing budget and tripling previous enrollment.

1995-1997 **President Emerita, University of Colorado, and Professor, Depts of Psychiatry and Applied Dentistry, University of Colorado Health Sciences Center, Denver.**

Primary Responsibilities: Teaching and research in behavioral aspects of health, leadership, and health policy. Participation in local and national activities related to biomedical, behavioral, and health services delivery research and higher education policy and planning.

1991-1995 **President, University of Colorado.** The University of Colorado is a public doctoral-extensive research university enrolling nearly 40,000 students on four campuses.

Primary Responsibilities: Chief Executive Officer of the four-campus University of Colorado System, an AAU-member institution with a residential campus (Boulder), two urban campuses (Denver, Colorado Springs) and a health sciences center (now administratively part of the Denver campus). Appointed by and reporting directly to a publicly elected Board of Regents. Responsible for all academic and administrative aspects of University operations. Provide leadership and intellectual vision to advance the University's instructional, research and scholarship, and public service missions. Formulate the long-term strategic plan for the University and established resource priorities appropriate to advance this plan. Define University fiscal policy and oversees an annual operating budget of \$1 billion. Formulate and promote the University's policies for collegial shared governance and for cultural diversity among its faculty, staff, and students. Define the University's role and mission and advocate for its budget within Colorado public higher education. Lead private fund-raising effort. Represent the University's interests and accomplishments to diverse constituencies, including legislative and government entities, the business community, alumni, donors, and philanthropic organizations.

Major Accomplishments: Implemented a University-wide effort to improve undergraduate education that increased the first-year student participation in small-group academic programs to over 60%; increased classes in the core curriculum and simplified the core; improved advising, recruitment, and retention programs. Promoted and supported research mission, including the development of important collaborative research centers and facilities. From FY 92 through FY 94, sponsored program funding (awards) increased 38%, to more than \$275 million. Successfully completed five-year capital campaign, raising \$270 million against a goal of \$200 million. Improved management and efficiency in University programs by reducing proportionate administrative costs to lowest in all of Colorado public higher education institutions. Improved capital facilities from 1991 - 94 through planning and resource development (\$185 million from 1991 - 94). Planned and obtained approval for moving forward on development of the Colorado Springs campus as a residential campus. Oversaw the successful completion of a plan to privatize the University Hospital, resulting in improved financial performance and more effective relationships with other community health care organizations. Worked with the Health Sciences Chancellor to begin planning the development of a new health sciences campus (Fitzsimmons) in Aurora, Colorado.

Improved communication and advocacy for the University through statewide travel, legislative testimony, speeches, editorials, service on community and corporate boards and establishment of advisory groups. Over 6,000 individuals were hosted at presidentially-sponsored events each year. Established "New Realities" theme for communications, focusing on quality with affordability, accessibility, and accountability.

Improved planning and strategic processes by implementing an improved resource reallocation process; by initiating a business process transformation effort; by completing a unit-based diversity plan for the institution; by appointing blue ribbon

strategy teams to focus on critical management issues; by developing enrollment planning initiatives that resulted in new public policies and a 10-year framework for resource reallocation, program development, capital investment, and service to the state; by initiating an effort with faculty to restructure and strengthen faculty governance; by organizing a system-wide planning effort to update and improve human resource policies; and by working with the Board of Regents to strengthen, clarify, and improve Board roles in policy development.

Developed a national presence for CU through higher education associations such as the Association of American Universities, National Association of State Universities and Land Grant Colleges, American Council on Education and Business-Higher Education Forum. Developed a regional and national leadership role in collegiate athletics, including 1994-96 service as Chair of the NCAA Presidents' Commission. Established greater management accountability in CU athletics and supported the development of a Division II program at the Colorado Springs campus.

1990-1991 **Vice President for Academic Affairs and Research and Dean of the System Graduate School, University of Colorado.**

Primary Responsibilities: Chief academic officer for an AAU university comprising four campuses: CU-Boulder, Health Sciences Center at Denver, CU-Denver, and CU-Colorado Springs, enrolling a total of nearly 40,000 students. Primary liaison to the Colorado Commission on Higher Education; work with the Board of Regents; participate in activities involving governmental and community relations. Responsible for development and implementation of all academic policies; long-range planning, including enrollment, human resources, funding and evaluation of academic programs; development of research initiatives and technology management. Interact with faculty governance and provided leadership for intercampus graduate programs and interdisciplinary research activities. Carried out final review of all faculty personnel actions and academic program decisions.

Major Accomplishments: Developed and secured seed funding for a University-wide Global Change and Environmental Quality initiative. Revised the University's policies and procedures for technology transfer and relocated the patent and technology transfer administration to the Office of Vice President for Academic Affairs. Expanded the activities of and funding for the President's Teaching Scholars Program. Initiated major university-wide analyses and developed long-term recommendations to the governing board on enrollment planning, student financial aid, enrollment and tuition policy, and transfer articulation. Substantially expanded the President's Fund for the Humanities. Directed revisions of a university-wide conflict of interest policy.

Major Accomplishments: Reorganized the Office of the Graduate School to streamline operations and eliminate unnecessary procedures, while enhancing faculty participation in Graduate School governance; developed new system for equitable allocation of tuition scholarship funds for graduate assistants; began long range planning related to the role and responsibilities of the Graduate School.

Primary Responsibilities: Chief academic and executive officer for this professional school comprising three academic departments with undergraduate and graduate programs staffed by 40+ FTE faculty; responsibility for a major Frank Lloyd Wright designed residence now operated as a museum.

Major Accomplishments: During tenure as dean, conducted an evaluation that resulted in the merging of two departments and development of a new undergraduate program in Design; directed the School's first alumni relations effort including publication of four issues of an alumni newsletter; initiated the School's first fund-raising program; facilitated the academic review that resulted in the first accreditation of the School's Master of Urban Planning program; achieved funding for computer laboratory in planning and for a full historical structure study of the Darwin D. Martin House (Frank Lloyd Wright, 1904).

Management of faculty promotion and tenure review at the Provost level and administrative oversight of intercollegiate athletic and recreation programs. Special assignments, including new program initiatives, research policy issues, and recruiting of senior administrators, as well as representing the Provost at University, community, and higher education functions.

Major Accomplishments: Development of a variety of administrative procedures for a reorganized academic affairs structure in which the new position of Provost replaced prior Vice Presidents for Academic Affairs and Health Sciences; reorganization of the former Department of Recreation, Athletics, and Related Instruction as a Division of Athletics with upgrading of intercollegiate programs from Division III to II and an approved plan for Division I status; major roles in planning and initiation of new academic and research programs including University Fellowships for outstanding graduate students, seven University-funded interdisciplinary research centers, and other programs for the advancement of research and study in major areas of University strength.

I also participated on eight doctoral dissertation committees in Counseling and Educational Psychology, and other master's and doctoral committees in the Departments of Health Behavioral Sciences, Learning and Instruction, Orthodontics, and Psychology.

University of Colorado Denver, 2008 - present

CBH 6640 (2015-18) Leadership for Public Health Practice. I designed and taught this required foundational course in leadership for an MPH Concentration in Leadership for Public Health Practice. This is a hybrid course, taught with an intensive 2-day onsite session followed by online work. The onsite work is primarily experiential and includes individual assessment of leadership skills, followed by online coverage of both theoretical and practical topics in leadership. Most students are health professionals who are working full-time.

BESST Team Building and Leadership Development Workshop (2014-2018). I designed and taught this 15-hour course for post-doctoral and advanced graduate students, sponsored by an NIH Grant for Broadening Experiences in Scientific and Scholarly Training. Workshops contained both experiential and theoretical content focused on developing skills for a variety of work settings requiring teamwork in the scientific disciplines.

CBH/EPI 7020 (2012) Colorado School of Public Health course in Public Health Leadership for DrPH students. I designed and taught this first, required course in public health leadership for DrPH students with two other faculty members. The course involved significant use of standardized assessments with feedback, as well as presentation of leadership topics and guidance of team projects.

LITeS Director, 2012. I have recently assumed responsibility for directing the Leadership in Innovative Team Sciences (LITeS) program for the CTSA. I am redesigning the course to increase emphasis on collaboration for interdisciplinary team science and to insure the availability of support for senior scientists dealing with management challenges. The course meets for two full days quarterly, with ongoing group project work. Participants have included all Anschutz Campus deans, as well as a

number of department chairs and directors of major labs and training programs. The program is recognized nationally as a model for CTSA senior leadership training programs.

Teaching responsibilities at the University of Colorado Denver have included special courses for research faculty, sponsored by the Colorado Clinical and Translational Science Institute (CTSA). I have participated in planning these programs and developing instructional content. In addition to the Leadership in Innovative Team Sciences (LITeS) program, I have provided significant instructional content for the Co-Mentor program for faculty mentor-mentee pairs and for the program involving junior investigators with K awards. In addition, I have provided leadership training for groups in the College of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences, the School of Dental Medicine, the College of Nursing, the LEADS program, and the Colorado School of Public Health.

Mentoring of graduate students is an ongoing part of the work of the Center for Native Oral Health Research, for which I am PI. I have supported the work of students from Dentistry, Epidemiology, Biostatistics, Pharmacy, and one undergraduate student in Public Health.
