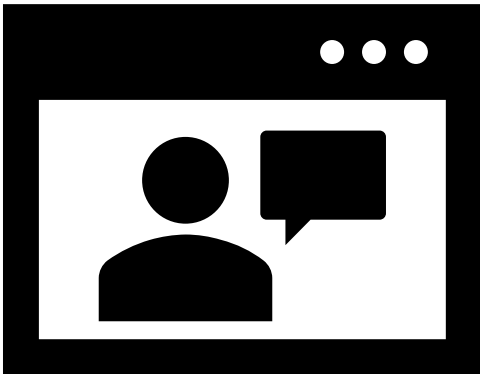

Christopher Spencer Greeley, MD, MS

Dr. Greeley is Chief of the Section of Public Health and Child Abuse Pediatrics at Texas Children's Hospital and a Professor and Vice-Chair for Community Health in the Department of Pediatrics at Baylor College of Medicine. He also served on the Board of Directors of Prevent Child Abuse America from 2005-2014 and was Chair from 2009-2013. Dr. Greeley was the 2006 Ray E Helfer Award winner is the immediate Past-President of the Ray E. Helfer Society. In 2017 he was appointed chair of the Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention Task Force for Texas and was elected to the American Pediatric Society. He received the Ray Helfer Award from the AAP in 2006 and the Helfer Society Award from the Ray E. Helfer Society in 2021. He was appointed to the City of Houston's Child Friendly City Initiative Taskforce by Mayor Turner, in 2021.

He received his medical degree from the University of Virginia in 1992 and complete internship and residency in pediatrics at Vanderbilt University. He received a Masters in Clinical Research from the University of Texas Health Science Center in Houston, with a special concentration on Comparative Effectiveness Research.

Nancy Correa, MPH has dedicated her career to making systematic changes to improve the lives of vulnerable children. Nancy is currently the Practice Administrator for the Section of Public Health Pediatrics at Texas Children's Hospital.
