I understand that there are safety and health risks inherent with traveling to and working at the Trifinio clinic in Guatemala. **Zika virus is known to be present in the Trifinio region, which may cause birth defects (microcephaly) if pregnant women are infected. Therefore I will not plan to be pregnant during my Guatemala rotation and if I become pregnant I will notify rotation personnel that I need to cancel or reschedule as soon as possible.** If you are male and become infected with Zika during your rotation and your partner is pregnant or intends to be pregnant you will need to follow the CDC recommendations for prevention of Zika sexual transmission. International OBGYN Residency Elective

The International OBGYN Residency elective will encompass a 6-week period of time in the 2nd year of residency training, with a portion of the time done in the United States and a portion on site in rural Guatemala. The focus of the elective is to expose residents to concepts, difficulties, and techniques used in women's global health practice and research, including exposure to public health methodology and practice. This is NOT a clinical elective. Residents will be chosen for the elective in 2016-2017 based on site and project availability. The resident will work very closely with mentors within the Center for Global Health, and specifically with Dr. Gretchen Heinrichs to define a research objective and timeline. The time away will be funded by the resident including all travel and living costs in the U.S. and Guatemala. Spanish fluency is strongly preferred.
