 Close contact with the animals






Handling Practices

 - Bison typically become aggressive and dangerous
 - Worker and animal safety compromised










High stress practices may lead to injuries and damaged equipment





Animal flow



Squeeze chute	5/7	1/2
Ready chute design	3/7	1/2
Dusty conditions	3/7	0/2
Unsafe round-up methods	2/7	0/2
Inadequate confinement practices	2/7	0/2
Lack of Personnel Safety barrier	2/7	0/2

Recommendations: Gathering and Handling Bison

 "Low-stress" bison handling methods

- Minimize risk to workers and to animals
- Basis: Apply pressure and release


